



AAT is working towards delivery of remote invigilation

On 13 May, AAT announced it was working towards introducing remote invigilation for some of its assessments where it is appropriate to do so. This page will be updated over the coming weeks as the project develops to support customer needs and feedback.

Over recent weeks, we have been conscious of the need to support the wide range of students and training providers in these difficult times. We have had to ensure we have a robust and secure way of delivering assessments that also satisfy our obligations as an Ofqual regulated awarding organisation with qualifications listed on the key stage 5 performance tables. We are now confident we have solutions that can work for many of you.

Assessments we aim to deliver in August through remote invigilation

Assessments will be available in a phased approach and we will also publish a revised synoptic schedule for impacted assessments in due course. We are targeting August for delivery of the following assessments:

- Advanced Diploma in Accounting – Level 3 (Level 6 in Scotland):
 - Advanced Bookkeeping (AVBK)
 - Financial Accounts Preparation (FAPR)
 - Management Accounting: Costing (MMAC)
- Professional Diploma in Accounting – Level 4 (Level 8 in Scotland):
 - Professional Diploma Synoptic Assessment (PDSY)

Details of the remaining assessments and the schedule will be published as soon as they have been confirmed.

Other assessments will follow.

Assessments we cannot deliver through remote invigilation

Unfortunately, the following assessments are not able to be assessed via remote invigilation due to security issues, and the requirement for students to download and save live assessment material onto a local PC:

- Level 1 Access Award in Accounting Software (AAWS)
- Level 2 Certificate in Accounting – Using Accounting Software (UACS)
- Level 3 Diploma in Accounting Synoptic (AVSY).

We are continuing to investigate possible solutions for these assessments and will provide further updates in due course.

Technical requirements

In order to access remote invigilation, students will need equipment at home which meets specific technical requirements. As such we recognise that remote invigilation may not be accessible to all students. More detailed information will be published as soon as it is available.

We are excited by the opportunity to use innovative technology to deliver assessments and help our students on their journey to complete their qualifications. This technology will enable students to access assessments under secure conditions.
